journey as a young volunteer. She fell in love with the BGCSA mission, and her passion for STEM eventually led to her



In the new program from Boys & Girls Clubs of America, "Journeys: Paths to Adulthood", young people find the space, support and tools they need to navigate the journey of adolescence and emerge as strong, healthy young adults. This targeted program for ages 10-14 helps youth develop healthy attitudes and lifestyles they will carry into adulthood.

# Ocean in my Bones





Several Club kids attended the "An Ocean in My Bones" stageplay held at Mobile County Training School. The annual Spirit of Our Ancestors Festival is an event sponsored by the Clotilda **Descendants Association (CDA)** that fulfills the mission to educate descendants and others about the history and culture of the 110 African captives who arrived in Mobile in 1860. The centerpiece of the last two Festivals (2022 and 2023) was the play "An Ocean in My Bones," the creation of playwright Terrance Spivey. The play begins in present-day (2019) Mobile, following the identification of the Clotilda in its burial water. The Africans were resurrected to tell their story through compelling drama, spiritual song, and African dance.





#### Owl in for **STEM**

Exciting day in STEM class! The young scientists in the Foley Boys & Girls Club dove into the world of biology by dissecting owl pellets. Pellets are the undigested parts of an owl's food that are coughed up by the owl. They can be pulled apart to find small bones and identify what the owl has been eating. ## Family Engagement Coordinator



In February, Harrietta Eaton, BGCSA Family Engagement Coordinator, alongside Tiffany Pogue, Program Director for Social/Emotional Wellness programs held Family Engagement Nights at the Kiwanis and Harmon locations. Family Engagement Nights is a new initiative held monthly at various Clubs and funded through grant dollars from Alabama Alliance of Boys & Girls Clubs. The new Trauma Informed/Mental Health Grant address the emotional, social, and mental health needs of Club youth and families. During the event, Club kids can play games and win prizes, while their parents fill out a needs assessment form to see what community services they may qualify for.

Eaton in her role will oversee the implementation of the Trauma Informed/ Mental Health Grant. She will provide crucial assessment, outreach, referrals to community services, and support for Club staff, youth, and families. She will also collaborate with community resources to develop evidence-based programs for emotional well-being.
